# Football

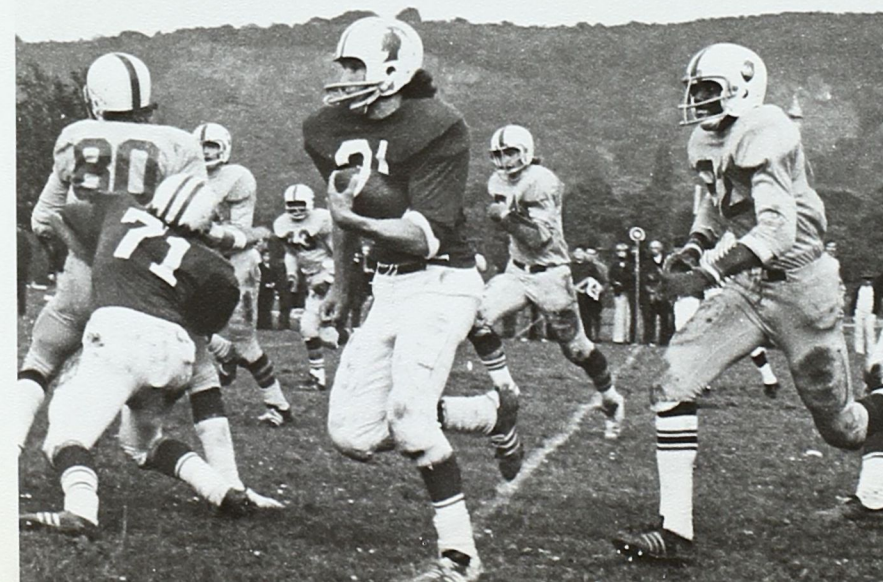
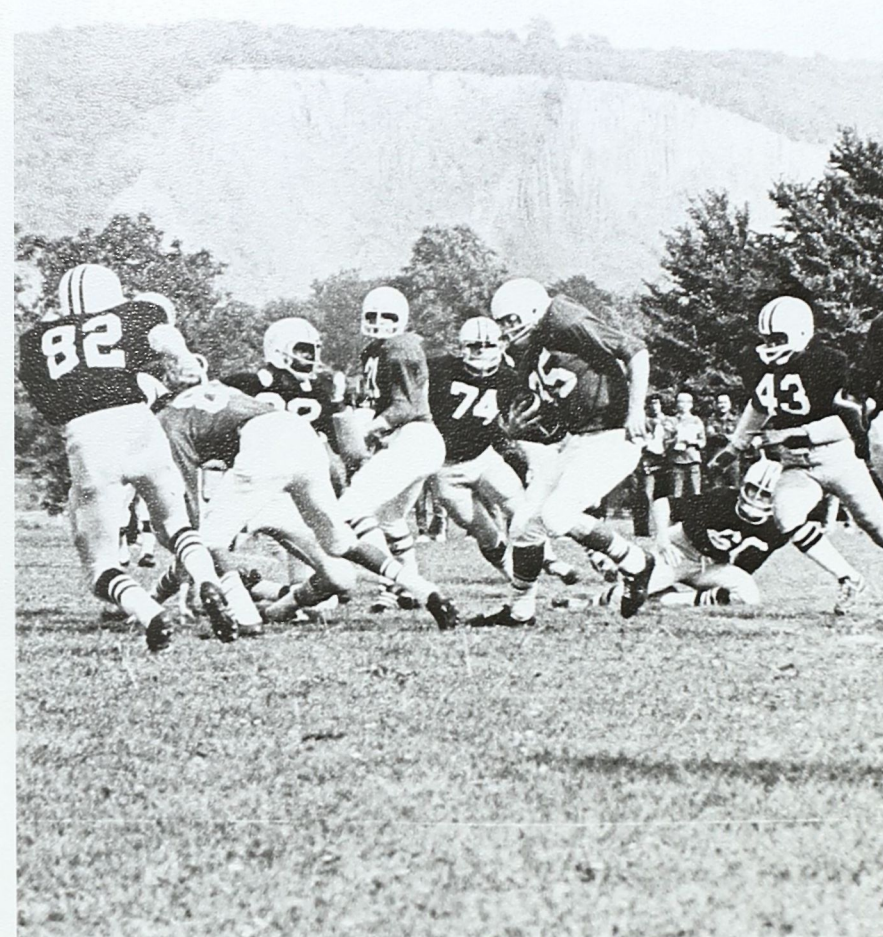




A season that began with optimism proved to be a real challenge for both players and coaches. We started out in September with 34 players, twenty of which were new to our system. In every game the Crusaders showed their ability to be equal to that of their opponents, and with a little luck, a 2-4-1 season could have just as easily been 5-2.









1974 was an exciting year for cross country at Bonn. 22 guys and girls braved the miserable weather and the hard work to put together a regional championship team. The addition of the girls who finished the season undefeated brought more excitement and fan interest to this fast growing sport. The Crusaders qualified 5 girls and 5 boys for the finals, a feat not matched by any other school in Europe. Coach Warfield described this team as, "A together outfit that thrived on bad weather conditions, mud, hard work, and respect for each other."





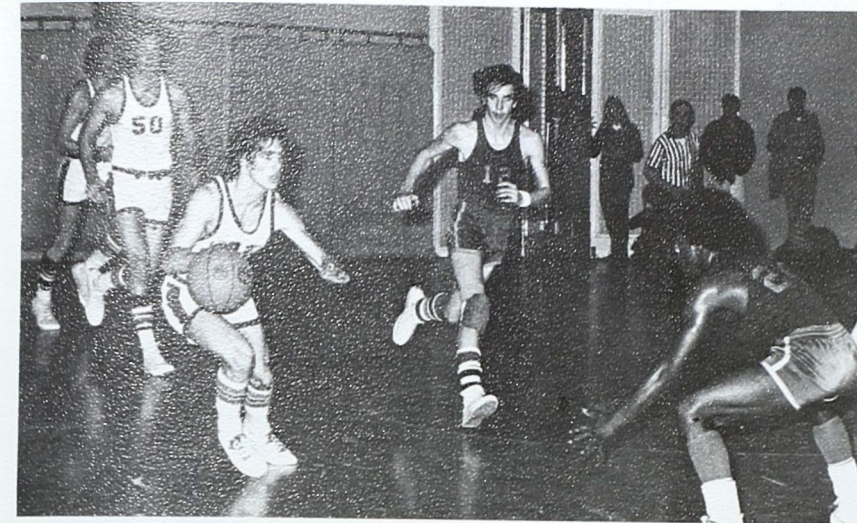


## Powder Puff

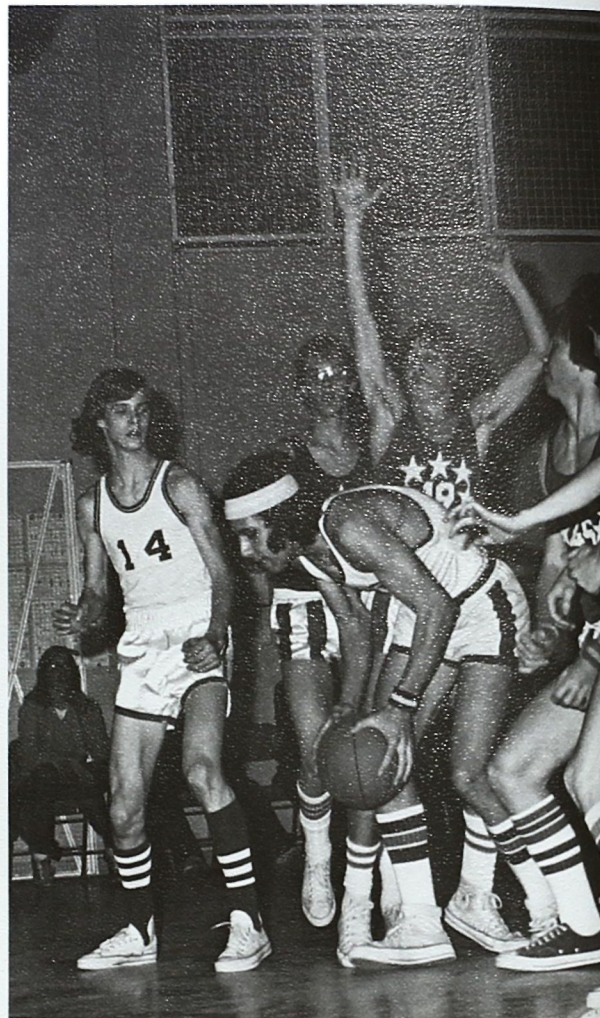

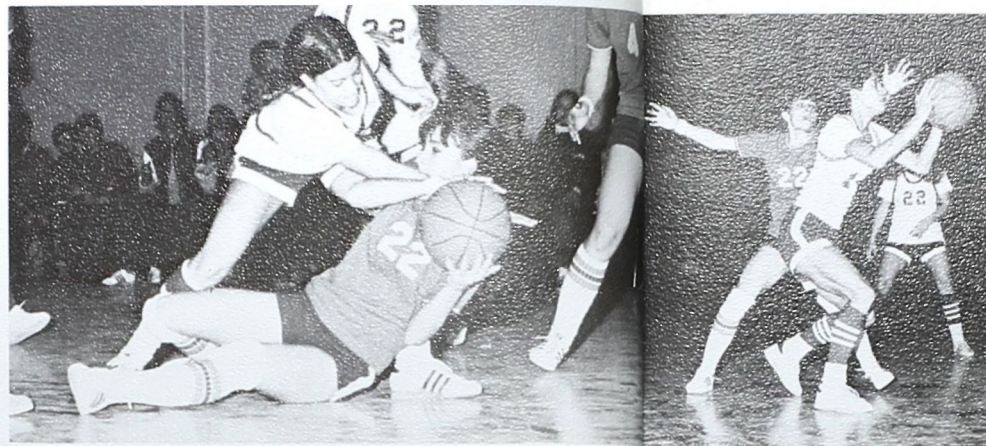


After a while they became known as the "Brady Bunch" for the man who's responsible for putting life into Bonn's JV Basketball team, Coach Brady. What a great team they made.

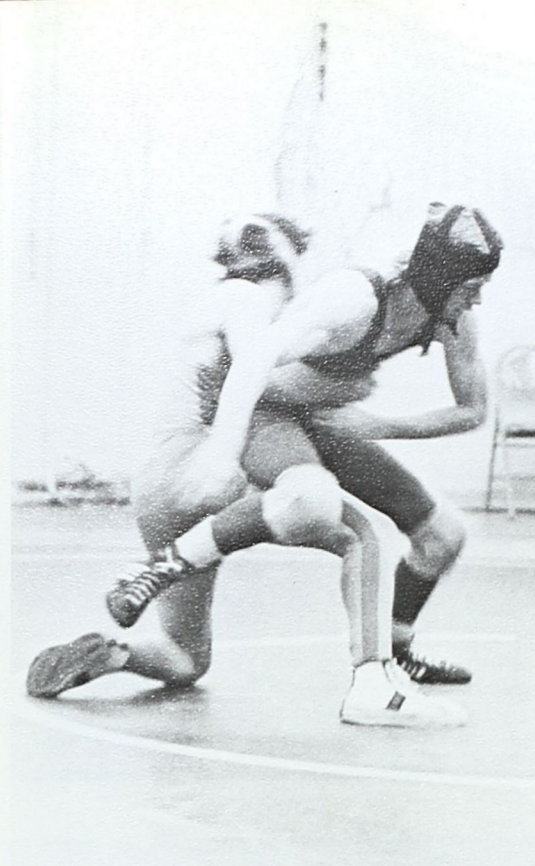


Girl's basketball, one of those "New Editions" caught on fast and we couldn't help but notice them getting into a little "man to man" combat. They really got in there and fought.

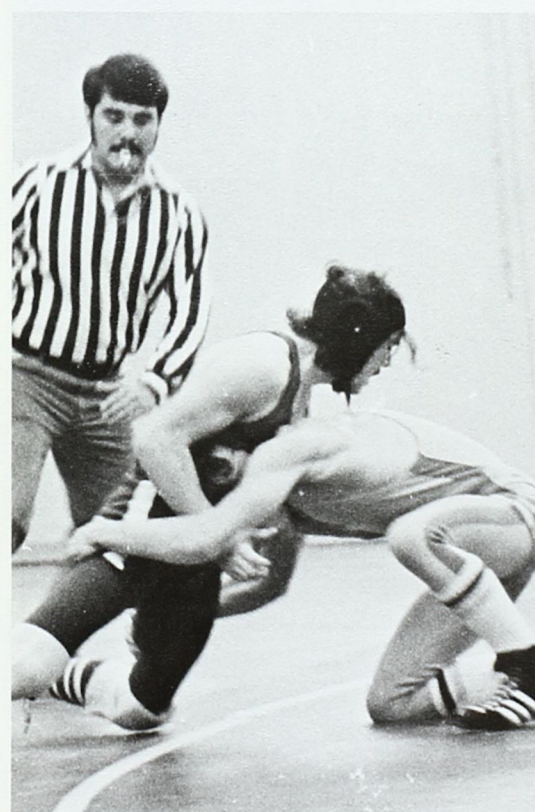

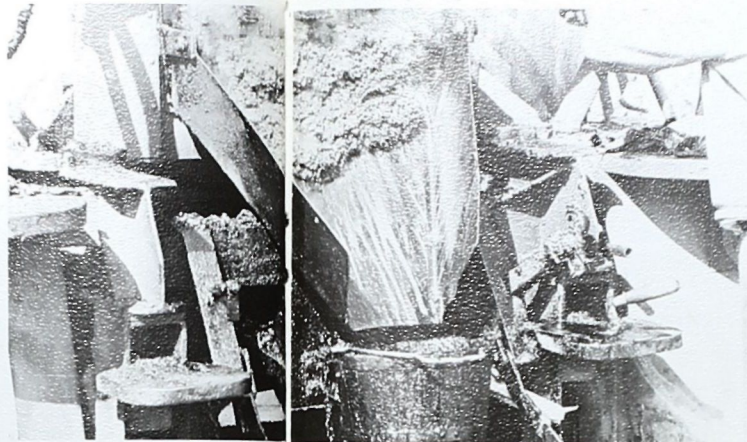




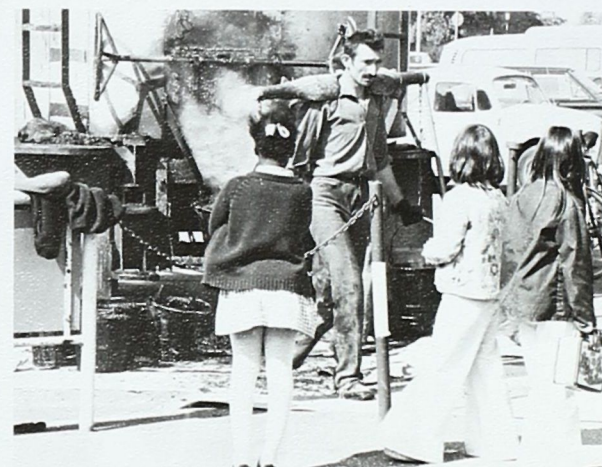
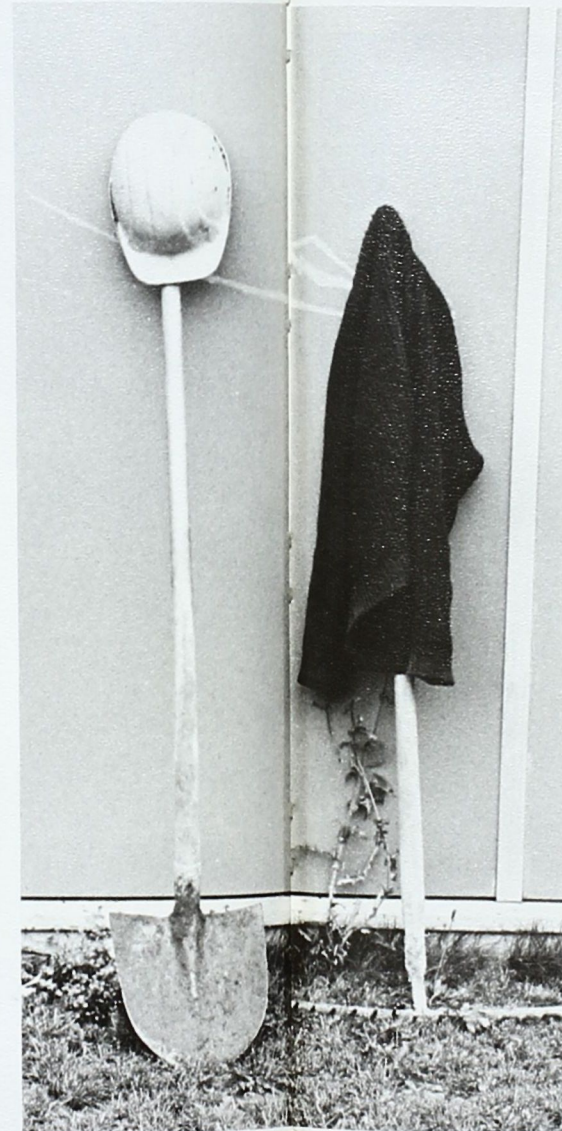
"Hey Teach was it a cup of peanut butter or a cup of vanilla flavoring?" Teachers often get a bum deal, sometimes even a pie in the face.
