






Football





























At the beginning of the school year, we came and found ourselves in the midst of tar, ladders, rakes and rocks...But we got two new rooms so it was worth it.














Well here is an Alumnus sneeking in a little thought. Anyway enough chauvinism.


Don't forget Bonn, Don't forget all the good times. People who are just great, pranks, or something dumb that happened. Now they make me happy, sad, and cry.


